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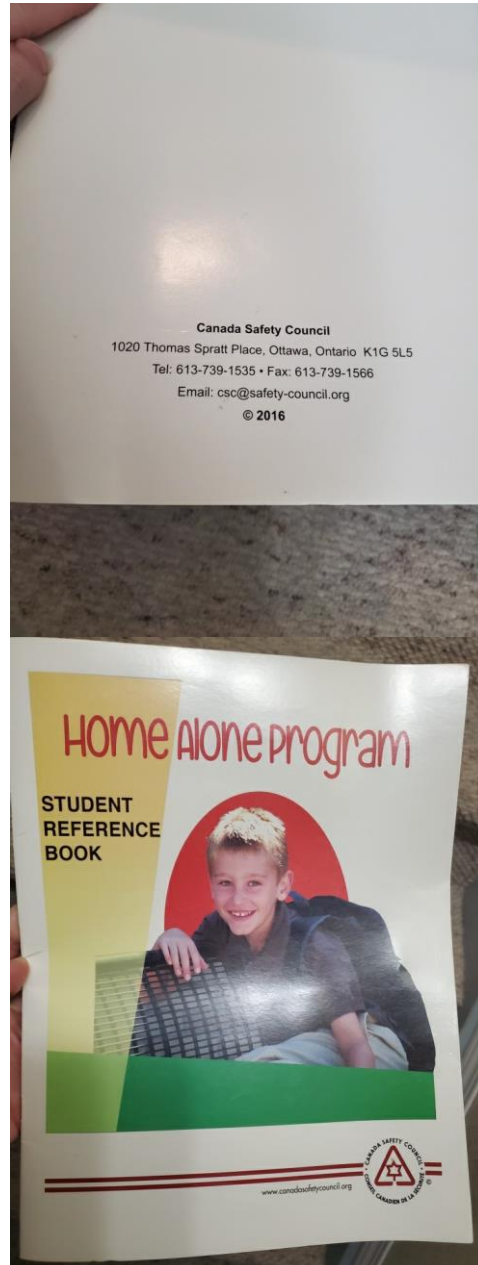

BRIAN TRAINOR</p> <p>After 27 years of policing, and having seen most types of bullying, cyber-bullying, and workplace harassment, the time had come to educate students, employees, and seniors on how to prevent abuse and harassment.</p>	<p>HBCS has partnered with the RCMP to work with students grades 7-12 on an in- house project around safety of social media use. HB has been identified as an area with risky online behaviors. A not-so-new site is getting lots of new traffic. It is called Omegle. Omegle is a free online chat website that allows users to socialize with others without the need to register. The service randomly pairs users in one-on-one chat sessions where they chat anonymously using the names "You" and "Stranger" or "Stranger 1" and "Stranger 2" in the case of Spy mode.</p> <p>Ask RCMP if they are willing to do anything with the 4-6 group as far as awareness Look into guest speaker</p>
